Test and quiz grades are entered into the grade book by points for correct answers. Keep up with your work and do not fall behind in reading the assigned literature because "pop" quizzes are possible. No matter what, you will always know how something is graded before you start the assignment. Students should keep a record of point totals in case there is a discrepancy. Grades will be posted online Friday mornings.</p> <p>Do not be afraid to ask for help or advice to improve your work. I am here to help you.
