Classroom Expectations

What happens if a student breaks a classroom/school rule?

1. Verbal Warning
2. After School Detention
3. Parent Contact
4. Referral to Office

(consequences can include Saturday Detention, In School Suspension, etc.)

How can I get extra help?

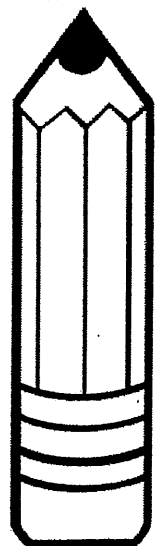
Make Up Work Policy

“Students are required to make up all missed work within a maximum of one (1) school week (5 days) after returning from any absence. This includes students on a pre-approved trip of more than one (1) day. If a student is absent on the day of a scheduled assessment they will be required to complete that assessment on the day he/she returns to school unless other arrangements are made with the teacher.”

What if I pass work in late?

Turning in work on time is important to build upon previously learned skills.

If a student is struggling with the amount of work and deadlines, reasonable arrangements can be made with me about more time given on the assignment.
